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# INTRODUCTION

- Missional churches are not about a particular program or isolated project.
- At the very heart of missional church is a group of people who are concerned with the bigger purpose of bringing God's word into the larger community outside their wall.
- The health of any church is not its sitting capacity but its sending capacity.

# Introduction

- God is about a big purpose in & for the whole of creation.
- The church has been called into life to be both the means of this mission & a foretaste of where God is inviting all creation to go.
- So the community of God's people exists, not for themselves but for the sake of the work.
- A missional church is a community of God's people who live into the imagination that they are, by their very nature, God's missional people.

# Introduction

- In order for the church to be missional it starts with YOU.
- Your mind-set as a congregant must think mission.
- A great commitment to the great commandment & the great Commission will lead to growing a great missional church.
- Grow the church from the outside in & not from the inside out.

# GOD AND GOALS

## God and Goals

- We get trapped in the world's grand goals.
- These goals always boil down to more, bigger and best.
- Scriptures describes them as indulgence, greed and pride.
- Most Christians come to God out of desperation when they realized that their lives are characterized by fear & anxiety.
- The evidence to the contrary is lack of peace, spiritual growth and a growing doubt about God.

# GOD AND GOALS

God set goals:

“Come out from their midst & be separate” says the Lord. “And don’t touch what’s unclean; and I’ll welcome you”.

[2 Corinthians 6:17]

“so shall we all at last attain to the unity inherent in our faith & our knowledge of the Son of God – to mature manhood, measured by nothing less than the full stature of Christ”

(Eph. 4:13)

# GOD AND GOALS

- What's is then your goal?
- Is it based on worldly standards or is it based on God's very high standards?
- God's standards are non-negotiable.

**Make sure your goal has God's approval?**

# GOD AND WORK

## A. God and work

- i. Over a lifetime, the average person spends, 100 000 hrs working.
- ii. Often this work carries some dissatisfaction with it.
- iii. Understanding what God says about work will help us find satisfaction in what we do.
- iv. It will also place you in a position where the Lord can make you prosper.

# GOD AND WORK

- B. God created work for our benefit
  - i. The first thing God did with Adam was to assign him work. [Gen 2:15]
  - ii. The Lord created work for us in the sinless garden of Eden.
  - iii. After all, when sin entered the world, work was made more difficult. [Gen 3:17 – 19]

# GOD AND WORK

## C. God's perspective of work

### a. Work is necessary

- i. Work is so important that God gave a command to labour [Exod 34:21]
- ii. Paul wrote in 2 Thessalonians 3:10  
*“if a man will not work, he shall not eat”*

# GOD AND WORK

## b. Work develops character

- i. One of the primary purposes of work is to develop character.
- ii. While the carpenter builds the house, the house is building the carpenter.
- iii. While the doctor diagnoses a patient, the patient is diagnosing the doctor.
- iv. The skill, diligence, manual dexterity and judgment are refined.
- v. A job is not only meant to earn money, but to develop Godly character on the life of the worker [Prov 12:24].
- vi. Scripture reveals that we are actually serving the Lord as we work [Colossians 3:23-24]

# GOD AND WORK

- vii. Consider your attitude towards work.
- viii. If you could see God as your boss, would you be more faithful, absolutely honest, no dishonest sick leave, and so on.
- ix. The most important question you need to answer everyday before starting to work is:  
*“for whom do I work? You work for Christ.*

# GOD AND WORK

## D. God's work responsibilities

### a. God gives us our job skills

- i. Because God has given each person unique skills and talents, all occupations are equal in God's eyes.
- ii. David was a shepherd and a king, Luke was a doctor, Lydia was a retailer who sold purple fabric, Daniel was a public servant, Paul was tentmaker, and finally our Lord Jesus was a carpenter.

# GOD AND WORK

## b. God gives us our success

- i. Joseph is an example of God helping a person to success [Gen 39:2-3].
- ii. We've job responsibilities, but it's the Lord that gives success.

## c. God controls promotion & Advancement

- i. As much as it may surprise you, people do not control whether you will be promoted.
- ii. The Lord controls your successes and promotions  
[Psalm 75:6 – 7]

# GOD AND WORK

## E. Our work responsibilities

### a. We are to work hard

- i. Paul's life was an example of courageous hard work [2 Thessalonians 3:8-9].
- ii. Scripture condemns laziness, and encourages diligence and hard work [Ecclesiastes 9:10 & Proverbs 12:27]

# GOD AND WORK

- b. We are not to overwork
  - i. Hard work, however, should be balanced by the other priorities of life.
  - ii. If your job demands so much of your time and energy that you neglect your relationship with Christ or your loved ones, then you're working too hard. [Exodus 34:21]
  - iii. Rest can be a question of faith.
  - iv. Is the Lord able to make our six days of work more productive than the seven days?.
  - v. The Lord instituted weekly rests for our physical, mental, and spiritual health.

# GOD AND WORK

- C. We are to honor our employers
  - i. Godly people always honor their superiors  
[1 Peter 2:18]
  - d. We are to honor fellow employees & never slander them
    - i. It's a sin to utter falsehood about a fellow employee [Prov 30:10]
  - e. We are to be honest
    - i. Don't steal, don't lie, don't deceive one another.  
[Leviticus 19:11]

Let's look at honesty and integrity as virtues of life

# GOD AND HONESTY

- Honesty
  - Precedes integrity.
  - Is permanent in nature.
  - Builds lasting relationship.
  - Brings one closer in the fellowship with God.
- Why God established the standard of honesty?
  - God wants us to be completely honest [Prov 6:16-17 & 12:22/ Leviticus 19:11].
  - Truthfulness is one of Gods' attributes [John 14:6/1 Peter 1:15].
  - Dishonesty & Christianity don't sit well together [Proverbs 14:2].
  - We cannot be dishonest & love our neighbour [Romans 13:9 -10]

# GOD AND HONESTY

- Honesty as a requirement for leadership.
  - A dishonest leader produces dishonest followers [Proverbs 29:12]
  - Dishonesty should disqualify a person from leadership [Exodus 18:21].
  - It is important to be honest in small things [ Luke 16:10].
  - Do not accept bribes [Exodus 23:8/Proverbs 17:23].
  - Teach honesty to children [Proverbs 22:6]
    - Teach verbally [Deuteronomy 6:6-7]
    - teach by example [1 Corinthians 11:1/Luke 6:40].
    - Teach by involvement [1 Chronicles 12:14]

# GOD AND HONESTY

- Blessings for the honest
  - A more intimate relationship with the Lord [Proverbs 3:32].
  - Blessings on your family [Proverbs 20:7]
  - Full life [Proverbs 20:7]
  - Abundance [Proverbs 15:6]
- Curses for the dishonest
  - Alienation from God [Proverbs 3:32]
  - Trouble with family [Proverbs 15:27]
  - Shorter life [Proverbs 21:6]
  - Lack of abundance [Proverbs 13:11]

# GOD AND INTEGRITY

- Integrity
  - Comes from ‘integer’ meaning whole, unified, complete, open, undivided, without duplicity or pretense.
  - Person with integrity keeps his/her word even if it hurts.
  - His/Her public & private life enjoy the same standards.
- Why God established the standard of Integrity?
  - Integrity pleases God [1 Chronicles 29:17].
  - Integrity provides security [Proverbs 10:9].
  - Integrity establishes credibility so that evangelism can be effective [Philippians 2:15].
  - Integrity provides guidance & confirms God’s direction [Proverbs 11:13].
  - Integrity prolongs leadership [Proverbs 28:16]

# GOD AND INTEGRITY

- Consequences of breaking your integrity
  - I will dishonor the Lord - my Creator.
  - I will cause pain & shame to myself & my family.
  - My sin will be revealed & will have to account.
  - I will destroy my example & credibility in my family, my church & society.
  - I will put a heavy weight on my shoulders, lose my self respect.
  - I will experience an agony of heart & soul that is a thousands times greater than the temporary advantage & pleasure of sin.
  - I will jeopardize the faithful testimony & work of many years of other faithful Christians in my community.
  - I will give the devil the Greatest Joy ever.

# GOD AND INTEGRITY

- How to develop integrity?
  - Value the integrity of your heart [1 Kings 9:4/Proverbs 4:23].
  - Have a healthy fear of discipline [Hebrews 12:11].
  - Decide before hand never to compromise or be defiled [Psalm 15:1].
  - Draw a clear line on your limits of behavior & step well back from it [Genesis 4:7].
  - Be on your guard at all times [Philippians 4:8/Job 31:1/Luke 16:10].
  - Surround yourself with honest people [1 Corin 15:33/Prov 29:24]
  - Be accountable to yourself first & others [James 5:16].
  - Pray & submit to the Holy spirit [Mat 15:33/Galatians 5:16-17].

# GOD AND MONEY

- a. God gave us guidelines to handle money because he loves us.
- b. The bible contains more than 2350 verses dealing with money and possessions.
- c. Compare that with 500 on prayer & less than 500 on faith.
- d. 16 of the 38 parables deal with handling money & possessions.
- e. In Mat, Mark, Luke & John alone out of 10 verses 1 is about money (288 in total)
- f. Jesus taught more about money than almost any other subject.
- g. The Lord said so much about money for both spiritual and very practical reasons.

# GOD AND MONEY

The Lord said so much about money for spiritual & very practical reasons.

- SPIRITUAL REASONS
  - A. How we handle money has a big impact on the intimacy of our relationship with Christ.
    - a. A more intimate relationship with Christ is the ‘true riches’ in life.

*“If you have not been faithful in the use of worldly wealth, who will entrust the true riches to you” [Luke 16:11]*

# GOD AND MONEY

- B. Money is the primary competitor with Christ for the lordship of our lives.

*“No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money” [Mat 6:24]*

# GOD AND POSSESSIONS

## A. Gods' responsibility

- a. God is the owner of everything [Psalm 24:1].
  - i. God owns the silver and gold [Haggai 2:8]
  - ii. God owns all the land [Leviticus 25:23]
  - iii. God owns all the animals [Psalm 50: 10 – 12]
  - iv. God created all things [Genesis 1:1]
  - v. God call those who are prepared to give up all [Luke 14:33]
- God is still the owner, he never transferred His ownership to people but possession.
- When we recognize God's ownership, every spending decision becomes a spiritual decision.

# GOD AND POSSESSIONS

- b. God is in control [Psalm 135:6].
  - i. Our heavenly Father is in control of every event [Psalm 135:6 & Daniel 4:34-35]
  - ii. God uses everything, even circumstances for His ultimate good [Romans 8:28].
  - iii. To accomplish his intentions [Gen 45:5 – 8]
  - iv. To develop His children's character [Rom 5:3 – 4]
  - v. To discipline His children [Heb 12: 6,10,11]
- c. God will provide for our needs [Philippians 4:19]
  - i. God - Jehova-Jireh meaning provider [Gen 22:14 & Mat 6:33]
  - ii. God is both predictable and unpredictable.
  - iii. He's predictable in His faithfulness to provide [1 Kings 17:4,6]
  - iv. He's unpredictable in how He will provide.

# GOD AND POSSESSIONS

## B. Our responsibility

- a. We are stewards of Gods' possessions
  - i. A steward is a manager of some else's possession.
  - ii. Have a logic of an administrator & a heart of an owner.
- b. We are to be faithful [1 Corinthians 4:2]
  - i. We are to be faithful with all that we possess.
  - ii. We are to be faithful stewards not only of the 10% but the 90%.
  - iii. All we have is the Lord's and we are to manage in a way that's pleasing to Him.
  - iv. We are to be faithful in little things [Luke 16:10]

# GOD AND POSSESSIONS

## c. Fruits of faithfulness

- i. Grow closer to Christ [John 14:21].
  - i. Faithfully applying God's financial principles will help you grow in your love for Christ.
  - ii. Develop godly character.
    - i. God uses money to reveal and refine our character.
    - ii. How we handle money is an external indicator of our spiritual maturity.
    - iii. Do you use your money to gamble or give?
- iii. We will begin to have financial stability
  - i. We will spend more wisely, save for the future and give more to the work of God.

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON DEBT

- A. What scripture say about debt?
  - a. Debt is discouraged [Romans 13:8].
  - b. Debt is considered slavery [Proverbs 22:7].
  - c. Debt presumes on the future [James 4:13 - 15].
    - i. Assumption of earning enough money in the future.
    - ii. Bible discourages presumptions [James 4:13 – 15].
  - d. Repay what is borrowed [Psalm 37:21/Proverbs 3:27-28]
  - e. In the old testament:
    - i. Debt was a curse for disobedience [Deuteronomy 28:15, 43-44].
    - ii. Freedom from debt was a reward for obedience [Deuteronomy 28:1-2,12].

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON DEBT

## B. Some factors that lead to debt.

- i. Lack of knowledge - most people have not been trained to handle money God's way.
- ii. Lack of planning & discipline - Some people spend impulsively because they don't follow a spending plan.
- iii. Indulgence - some people spend to satisfy fleshly desires.
- iv. Coveting – a disease that makes people buy what they don't need.
- v. Lack of contentment – always unhappy about what you have.
- vi. Circumstances - emergencies, eg illness or loss of job.
- vii. Co-signing/surety [Proverbs 17:18].

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON DEBT

- c. When is debt acceptable? The bible is silent:
  - i. To open up a business.
  - ii. Buy a house.
  - iii. Pay for education.
- d. What guidelines can I follow?
  - i. Make debt the exception not the rule.
  - ii. Repay as soon as possible.
  - iii. Develop a written repayment plan.

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON DEBT

- e. Seven prerequisite for acquiring debt
  - i. Be committed to pay it back [Romans 13:7,8].
  - ii. Never co-sign [Proverbs 17:18].
  - iii. Avoid surety [Proverbs 22:26,27].
  - iv. Avoid 'presumptions on the future' [Proverbs 27:1].
  - v. Never place your family at risk [1 Timothy 5:8].
  - vi. Avoid consumer debt [Deuteronomy 15:1-4].
  - vii. Use revolving credit wisely

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON DEBT

- f. How to get out of debt?
  - i. Pray [Phillipians 4:6].
  - ii. Track all your expenses a month.
  - iii. Accumulate no debt.
  - iv. List all your debts & assets - decide which assets you can sell to get money to reduce your debt.
  - v. Use a written spending plan or budget - this will help you to see overspending before it occurs & identify extra money to pay debt quicker.
  - vi. Establish a repayment plan with creditors - do not ignore creditors reminders.
  - vii. Pay the smaller debts first & the ones with higher interest rate.
  - viii. Consider earning additional income.
  - ix. Reduce spending – is the word ‘Sale’ inviting you to buy?

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON SPENDING

## A. Spending

### a. Learn to be content

- i. The word content is mentioned seven times in Scripture and six of those times it has to do with money. [Phillipians 4:11 - 13].
- ii. We're not born content, rather we learn contentment.
- iii. Biblical contentment is an inner peace that accepts what God has chosen for our present work & financial situation.  
[1 Timothy 6:8 & Hebrews 13:5]

### b. Learn to avoid coveting

- i. Coveting means craving another person's property. [Exodus 20:17].
- ii. The last of the ten commandments prohibits coveting.

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON SPENDING

- c. Do not determine your spending by comparing it to others
  - i. **Some people get into financial troubles because of competition.**
  - ii. **Some spend more than they can afford because of companies they keep.**
- D. Live simply
  - i. **Some live styles demand so much that our fellowship with God and our loved one's is compromised [1 Thessalonians 4:11 - 12].**
  - ii. **Scripture encourage a quiet and simple life.**
- E. Needs should be met within the body of Christ
  - i. **Your needs reflect your fellowship with Christ.**
  - ii. **Some needs are in contrast with our Christians values [2 Corinthians 8:13-15].**

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON SPENDING

## E. Be careful of advertising

- i. It creates contentment with what we have.
- ii. It communicates deceptive message of satisfaction/happiness after buying something.
- iii. It is meant to prompt you to spend money.
- iv. Seek the guidance & counsel of God before any spending.
- v. If you believe the purchase will not please God, don't buy.

## F. Develop and use a spending plan

- i. We are encouraged to plan how to spend.
- ii. We are also encouraged to be aware of our possessions  
**[Proverbs 27:23].**

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON SAVINGS

## A. SAVINGS

### a. Scripture encourages savings

- i. We are encourage to save for future needs [Proverbs 21:20]..
- ii. Joseph is an example of a person who saved [Genesis 41].

### b. Save only if also giving

- i. You can never save to deprive God.[ Luke 12:16 - 21, 34].

### c. Save regularly

- i. The fundamental principle is to spend less than you earn.
- ii. You don't have to earn a lot of money, but save consistently.  
[Proverbs 21:5].
- iii. Fifth of our harvest [Genesis 41:34].

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON SAVINGS

## D. What to save for?

- i. Unexpected emergencies.
- ii. Major purchases.
- iii. Longer term needs.

## E. Investments

- i. People place money saved with a hope of getting returns.
- ii. Scripture encourages us to
  - i. Avoid risky investments [Ecclesiastes 5:13].
  - ii. Diversify investments [Ecclesiastes 11:2]

# BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES ON SAVINGS

## F. Gambling

- i. The bible does not specifically prohibits gambling.
- ii. The laws and discipline of our church does prohibit.
- iii. Gambling is one of the 'get rich quick schemes' [Proverbs 28:22]

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

## A. GIVING

- Giving is one of the most fulfilling part of a Christian life.
- The Bible encourages us to be generous.
- There are more verses on giving than any other subject dealing with money.
  - a. Give out of a heart of love
    - i. Nothing praiseworthy than giving to the poor.
    - ii. If it's done without love it's no benefit to the giver.[1 Cor 13:3]
  - b. Give cheerfully
    - i. Give happily, joyfully and with purpose.[2 Cor 9:7]
    - ii. Be grateful for the opportunity to help others.
    - iii. Stop and examine your attitude in giving?

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- c. Give to God first
  - i. God expects a portion of what he has entrusted to us[Proverbs 3:9].
  - ii. God doesn't need our money but we need to give to his work.
  - iii. Determines how deep our fellowship is with God.
- d. Give what God has determined
  - i. God is expecting a tenth of all our crop.
  - ii. Tithing is a minimum expected of us.[Malachi 3:8-9/Mark 12:42 - 44]
- e. Blessings of giving
  - i. Giving draws our hearts towards God [Matthew 6:21].
  - ii. Giving develops Godly character & helps us conform to Christ  
[Phil 2:5]

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- iii. Giving allows us to put treasures in heaven [Mat 6:20]
- iv. Giving can produce a material increase to the giver [Prov 11:24-25]
- f. To whom should we give?
  - i. Give to the local church, Christian workers & Ministries [1 Timothy 5:17/1 Corinthians 9:14].
    - a. God's workers need to receive support.
    - b. Those involved in the Great commission needs support.
  - ii. Give to the poor [Mat 25: 34 - 45/Proverbs 14:31].
    - a. Hundreds of verses in the Bible remind us to give to their poor.
    - b. One of the most exciting truths is found in Mat 25:34-45.
    - c. Also find another classic truth in Prov 14:31, 22:19 & Galatians 2:10]

# THE GIFT OF SACRIFICIAL GIVING

- Sacrificial giving with a right attitude is possible only to Christians submitted to God.
- God will not allow His work retrogress because of lack of funds.
- He will redistribute His funds to Christians with a right attitude – those seeking His will & are willing to sacrifice their luxuries for the needs of others.
- Christians who bypass God's work because they refuse to experience even a slight discomfort have missed the joy of knowing that God is the provider.

# THE GIFT OF SACRIFICIAL GIVING

- Begin to sacrifice a small portion from your wants & desires for the needs of others.
- Ask God to lay their needs on your heart and then put your commitment to sacrificial giving.
- We receive in order to give not to satisfy our own desires.

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- What would you say if this would happen in our Church?
- Pastor comes to the pulpit & say:
  - “ There are far too many of you today for the one third forgiveness available. I can see some of you are not worthy to be in Church today, come back next week if you have not sinned much, there might be enough forgiveness”

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- Worship could never start this way, could it?
- With God there's no short supply & no limits
- With faith we saw what the prodigal son saw [Luke 15:11-32]
- That God is Generous with us well past what we deserve, all for Love.
- We've received grace upon grace [John 1:16]
- Our cups are running over [Psalm 23:5]

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- Jesus' life, death & resurrection suggests that God does not withhold anything from us.
- Jesus' taught that the Kingdom is worth any price [Mat 13: 44 - 45].
- God is the generous father of the prodigal son & the gracious owner of the vineyard [Mat 20: 1 -16].
- We are our worst enemies because God owns the earth, heavens and everything.

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- When we focus on scarcity, it seems as though there is not enough of anything, that God has not been generous.
- As a result our faith shrinks down to what little can be seen, but in faith we can see abundance more than enough.
- Christian life as a steward means growing in the knowledge of God & discovering that God is made known in what He gives.

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- This is an ongoing spiritual experience & a substantial part of the joy in living a Christian life.
- How do we talk to ourselves? Is the offering during worship received or taken? Is giving an act of worship or paying the church's dues?
- Dues are paid ! gifts are given & received!
- Paul did not write that "God loves a cheerful payer" but he wrote that "God loves a cheerful giver" [2 cor 9:7].

# THE GIFT OF GIVING

- Words reflect habits of thought & belief.
- If our language speak of scarcity, not abundance, words like: “we don’t have much”, “we don’t have what others have”, “Most have more than we do” will be our vocabulary.
- If we say everything is in short supply, low expectations is justified.
- An offering is a gift from God.

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

## “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

The story goes:

I dreamt that I went to Heaven and an angel was showing me around. We walked side-by-side inside a large workroom filled with angels.. My angel guide stopped in front of the first section and said, "This is the Receiving Section. Here, all petitions to God said in prayer are received."

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

I looked around in this area, and it was terribly busy with so many angels sorting out petitions written on voluminous paper sheets and scraps from people all over the world. Then we moved on down a long corridor until we reached the second section. The angel then said to me, "This is the Packaging and Delivery Section.

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

Here, the graces and blessings the people asked for are processed and delivered to the living persons who asked for them. "I noticed again how busy it was there. There were many angels working hard at that station, since so many blessings have been requested and were being packaged for delivery to Earth. Finally at the farthest end of the long corridor we stopped at the door of a very small station.

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

To my great surprise, only one angel was seated there, idly doing nothing. "This is the Acknowledgment Section," my angel friend quietly admitted to me. He seemed embarrassed "How is it that there is no work going on here?" I asked.

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

"So sad," the angel sighed. "After people receive the blessings that they asked for, very few send back acknowledgments ."

"How does one acknowledge God's blessings?"

I asked.

"Simple," the angel answered. Just say, "Thank you, Lord."

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

"What blessings should they acknowledge?" I asked.

"If you have food in the refrigerator, clothes on your back, a roof overhead and a place to sleep you are richer than 75% of this world. If you have money in the bank, in your wallet, and spare change in a dish, you are among the top 8% of the world's wealthy."

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

"And if you get this on your own computer, you are part of the 1% in the world who has that opportunity."

"If you woke up this morning with more health than illness ... you are more blessed than the many who will not even survive this day ."

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

"If you have never experienced the fear in battle, the loneliness of imprisonment, the agony of torture, or the pangs of starvation ... you are ahead of 700 million people in the world."

"If you can attend a church without the fear of harassment, arrest, torture or death you are envied by, and more blessed than, three billion people in the world "

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

"If your parents are still alive and still married  
..you are very rare ."

"If you can hold your head up and smile, you  
are not the norm, you're unique to all those in  
doubt and despair."

# “JUST SAY THANK YOU LORD”

If you can read this message, you just received a double blessing in that someone was thinking of you as very special and you are more blessed than over two billion people in the world who cannot read at all.

Ok, what now? How can I start?
